The leaflet also contains a map of South Gloucestershire indicating where you can go to buy the best organic foods, including meat, eggs, bread, cakes, ice cream, cider, ale, fruit, vegetables, milk and jams. The long-awaited Bradley Stoke Community School was opened on the 8 November by Iain Gray, managing director of Airbus UK. Visitors at the official opening were welcomed by the chairman of

September. For students the school is open from 8am until 5pm every day, aspiring to meet the Government's target for all schools to be open from 8am until 6pm all week for students by 2010. Students have the opportunity to access sport and enrichment activities and the library/learning resource centre before and after lessons every

The Club's ethos is to provide a friendly club for members to enjoy their football, to foster loyalty, encourage and reward effort and promote the Club, Town and local community of Bradley Stoke.
