It's been an incredibly busy term so far for BSTC and we continue to ensure the council operates in the best interests for its residents.

There have been a few pieces of work which should be given special mention;

Working in partnership with The Willow Brook Centre and local residents, Bradley Stoke Town Council has driven forward the installation of a gate between Manor Farm and the Willow Brook Centre. It is hoped that this gate will help to reduce the anti-social behaviour that residents were experiencing in this area during evening hours.

The largest, most in-depth consultation regarding youth provision in Bradley Stoke is due to start in September, engaging with local groups and the community school. The consultation, which will be led by South Gloucestershire Council in partnership with Bradley Stoke Town Council, is designed to rethink our existing youth provision to ensure that all sections of the youth population here in the town are being catered for.

The town council Office Staff continue to make savings and forge efficiencies in every area of the council's operation, to further improve the services we offer to you, our residents.

The new councillor team have now settled in to council business, busy undertaking casework on behalf of their ward residents and attending meetings to get business done. You can find details of your ward councillors via our new-look website which further enhances our accessibility to you.

The Bradley Stoke Town Council Firework display is scheduled for the 6th November and this year we are lucky enough to have Royal Representation attending the event. The Vice Lord-Lieutenant, Robert Bernays will carry out the official countdown. This is the first time Bradley Stoke has had Royal Representation at the event. I look forward to seeing you all there.

Bouncing Babies

Come & join us on Tuesdays 1 -3 pm Jubilee Centre, Bradley Stoke

Having a new baby is an exciting time, but it can also be exhausting and, in some cases, isolating – the old saying is certainly true; 'Babies don't come with a manual! Joining a group, however, with parents who have similar aged children, can be a lifeline.

Southern Brooks Community Partnership runs the Bouncing Babies group for parents/carers and their babies who are under 1. Each fun packed session provides opportunities for play, socialising and singing (so get practising those nursery rhymes!). Parents are free to play with their children using the many different good quality toys that we provide to help with the development of the 'baby brain' and the child parent relationship. The sessions also provide a great opportunity to meet other parents in similar situations, share experiences and form new friendships. Experienced staff are on hand to support and answer questions as required and refreshments are provided. In the past we have included activities such as baby massage, heuristic play and had visits from relevant organisations. We usually get involved in the Big Toddle to help raise funds for Barnardo's and we hold an annual Christmas party.

The venue and the staff provide a welcoming atmosphere that makes parents and their babies feel relaxed. We would love to hear from parents about activities that would be of interest, or suggestions of how we could further improve the group.

Bradley Stoke YFC (BSYFC) was founded in June 1998. Over the years the club has grown to a large size, covering a range of age groups, to allow children from Bradley Stoke the opportunity to train and play football. The club covers the age groups of U6 to U18, and has dedicated girl teams at U9, U10, U11 and U13. The total membership of the club currently stands at over 300 children, highlighting the success of the club and the dedication to allow children to play football in a safe and friendly environment.

In August 2010 the club achieved the highest status of being a FA Charter Standard Community Club. This level was achieved due to all the hard work of all the volunteers and coaches involved in the club. There are currently only seven other clubs in the South Gloucestershire County with this status. At the recent Gloucestershire

FA Awards Evening, the club won the FA Charter Standard Community Club of the Year 2011 and Martin Lee one of the club coaches was the winner of the FA Community Award – Outstanding Contribution to Community Football Award 2011.

The club annually operates the club-school link program where FA qualified coaches go into 14 local schools to provide football skills training for over 600 pupils. Also, the club, in partnership with the Bradley Stoke Town Council, organise the annual Bradley Stoke Football Festival, which takes place during the Community Festival, for Year 1 children and for Year 3 and 4 girls, where over 200 children participate in school teams. The club has been working with the Gloucestershire FA to develop girl's football in the local area and has now formed links with the Bristol Academy WFC.

Victim Support: working in your local community

Being a victim of crime is an unpleasant and often distressing experience. But, did you know that there is a free and confidential service, provided across England and Wales, to help anyone who has been affected by crime? We are Victim Support, a national charity established over 35 years ago, dedicated to meeting victims' needs and being the 'voice for victims' at both national Government and local level.

Our services, free and confidential and available six days a week, are designed to help victims overcome the impact of crime. The police will refer all victims, with their consent, to our victim care unit. Here trained workers make contact with victims and talk through any needs they might have. Many people will benefit from further one

to one contact and so we provide trained volunteers who will support victims and their families in their community. Victim Support also provides practical assistance, such as sourcing locksmiths or helping with insurance claims: anything which assists in overcoming the effects of the crime.

Being a witness. It can feel very daunting if a witness is called to court to give evidence. V.S. runs a Witness Service team in each criminal court, which provides early contact with witnesses, arranges pre trial visits to help familiarisation with the court and its procedures, and on the day support, with somewhere quiet and separate to wait. This helps many witnesses feel more assured about giving evidence and more confident about attending court.

FRIDAY 10TH JUNE - JUBILEE GREEN, JUBILEE CENTRE

For the first time, the first day of the Festival, the Picnic in the Park, all elements of the event were organised by staff from Bradley Stoke Town Council, in conjunction with the event team, Re-energise, with Mothers and their babies and young children attending to take refreshments, tea and coffee and also view a range of stalls and entertainments.

Local trades and crafts provided the stalls which ranged from cakes and pastries to jewellery and novelties alongside Information stalls. There was also a bouncy castle.

The entertainment was provided by Professor Panic who had been on site from the Wednesday providing his Big Top entertainment of juggling, circus skills and magic for the younger children. On the Thursday Prof Panic entertained pupils from the local primary schools who had been pre booked within an agreed schedule. This was fully booked within 2 weeks of the schools receiving the letters. Friends of Jubilee Green provided a fun treasure trail for the children which had a take up of over 75 youngsters! Steve Price, the Balloon Man, also provided his individual fun entertainment producing modelled balloons and displays.

It was estimated that slightly fewer parents and toddlers attended this year, possibly due to a heavy mid-morning shower, but the weather picked up later and everyone who attended enjoyed the event.

Bradley Stoke Community Festival 1st - 3rd June 2012

SATURDAY 11TH JUNE - JUBILEE GREEN

The second day of the Festival enjoyed a really sunny day and started slightly later at 11.45 rather than the scheduled 11.30 with the lorry trailer turning up late at 10.00 due to mechanical problems with the first lorry unit.

55 stalls attended ranging from local community projects and charity groups to craft and novelty stalls, tombola's, coconut shies and fun games to jewellery, local hotel displays. The stalls were co-ordinated by Southern Brooks Community Partnership. A range of RV's and motor homes were on display provided by Family Travel Centre which provided a very different backdrop to the Festival. The Grange Hotel did very well in selling over £125 worth of balloons for the balloon race and provided the main prize of a weekend for two at the hotel. Mayor, Ben Walker, launched the balloons along with local children towards the end of the day.14 catering and ice cream units attended with the traditional burger and hot dogs but also several Indian food outlets, a Mexican and Oriental catering operations. Of the 15 entertainments the new attractions included a bungee trampoline and the Bristol Zoo "Zoo to You" operation which took place in side The Jubilee Centre. This proved very popular with the children, giving them the chance to handle giant insects, snails and cockroaches from Madagascar.

Other attractions included Lennie the Road Train, which transported people around the Festival site along with local operations providing inflatables, quad bikes, carousel, tea cup rides, dome and slides as well as vintage side stalls being provided by the local churches and scouts. The main entertainment were the 5 bands that played in front of what was estimated at a crowd of 1,500 – 2,000 people at one time people the bands were headed up by the Counterfeit Bee Gees tribute band, who were particularly enjoyed along with local bands; Doing Time, Tundra, Trouble on the Green and the local winner of the Battle of the Bands, Cassette.

Dance performances were provided by Annette's Dance Academy, a solo performance by a representative from South Glos Asian Project, Bowsland Green Gym Club, Arabian Nights Belly Dancers and the South Glos Chinese Association providing traditional dance performances. On the Jubilee Green side there were demonstrations from the Dragon Tang Soo Do and the Taekwondo Martial Arts clubs.

Other entertainment for the youth was provided by the Southern Brooks Community Partnership who provided the teenagers with the opportunity to make music and provided a range of entertainments and rides! A football tournament took place with over 200 children from Year 3 / 4 taking part with prizes donated by Re-energize and the town council.

It was estimated that again over 6,000 adults and children attended the Festival throughout the day and enjoyed the range of music and especially the dance groups. Donations towards the mayor's Charity topped £2,880 from the suppliers and entertainments attending.

13TH JUNE - JUBILEE CENTRE & BAILEYS COURT

Unfortunately the Sunday was badly affected by the weather with continuous rain throughout the day. This did not deter the runners in the 10k run which again started at 09.30 from Jubilee Green organised by local charity group, Sole Sisters. It is believed over 500 runners took part and although the Marshall's were soaked the runners enjoyed the event.

The Cricket Tournament and bowls demonstration were cancelled with the morning church service being taken at the local Christ the King Church. The Skate Park competition was postponed due to the weather but has since taken place with over 150 people attending during the course of the Skate Park competition.





INCREASE IN CRIMINAL DAMAGE!

During the last financial year, Bradley Stoke Town Council spent over £7,000 to repair property vandalised in our town and this does not include the time taken to sort out the criminal damage or the many smaller scale incidents which can be fixed in-house. This ranges from broken glass to petrol-assisted fires.

So far this year, criminal damage costs are already in the region of £6,750. During the summer holidays, four of the seven play areas around our town had items out of use whilst waiting for replacement parts, not a good advert for our town and, most importantly, meant that our children do not have full use of the play items available.

Regular checks are made at our play areas, activity centres and bus stops. All criminal damage is reported to the Police and the South Gloucestershire Council Anti-social Behaviour Team. If anyone sees an act of criminal damage, please can you help us to help the Police catch the perpetrators by ringing 0845 456700 (or, from 19th September 2011, the new non-emergency number of 101) to report the incident and let the Town Council know on 01454 868080, especially if repairs are needed to make the area safe.

Grant Aid

Bradley Stoke Town Council has allocated a sum of money each year for grant aid to be awarded for small projects that benefit the local community (maximum grant is £500.00).
