Meet the New Mayor

Councillor Michael Hill

Michael John Hill was born and educated in North London. He initiated his career in a weekly newspaper, moving on to become a press officer at London Transport. Michael spent most of his career on media duties with the Ministry of Defence. At different times, he was head of public relations at the Royal Air Force Headquarters at High Wycombe and latterly at the Royal Navy's Fleet Headquarters at Northwood. His travels took him from Hong Kong to the Falkland Islands and from the West Indies to the Persian Gulf.

Cllr Michael started his political innings at the London Borough of Barnet in 1974 and served as a Borough Councillor at Barnet for 12 years. Afterwards, he moved to Northampton and served on Northampton Borough Council for 18 years, where he was Mayor in 2009-10. He served four years as a Northamptonshire County Councillor from 2005 to 2009 as well.

Michael and his wife Margaret moved to Bradley Stoke in 2017 and live near Baileys Court. He can often be seen walking his cockapoo 'Poppy' in the area. He was very fond of exploring the natural landscapes of Switzerland. His other hobbies include railways, photography, and football.

In 2019, Cllr Michael Hill was elected to the Bradley Stoke Town Council, representing the South Ward.

His Mayoral charities for 2021/22 are 'Dogs for Good', which is a life-transforming national charity, creating partnerships between people living with disability and specially trained assistance dogs and 'St Peter's Hospice', which is a local charity that provides care and support to adults who are living with a progressive life-limiting illness in the West of England region.

Mayor's Charities

St Peter's Hospice is the only adult hospice providing care for patients with life-limiting illnesses across Bristol, North Somerset, South Gloucestershire and parts of Bath and North East Somerset, an area covering almost 1 million people.



We have been established for over 40 years and have expanded from a starting point of just two nurses working in the community to our current position caring for thousands of patients a year.

Our key services include:

- An Inpatient Unit with 15 spacious rooms, all with large sliding doors opening out onto the tranquil gardens.
- A Day Services programme supporting out-patients and family members to feel more confident and empowered.
- Community Nurse Specialists who visit and care for patients in their own homes.
- Hospice at Home, providing expert care for patients in their own homes in the last days of life.



- Patient and Family Support which provides social work, spiritual, bereavement and therapy support to patients, families and carers.
- A 24/7 Advice Line open to all callers, which has been a great comfort and support to patients and family members throughout the pandemic.

All our services are completely free of charge to patients, but only 21% of our funding comes from the NHS. For the rest we rely on fundraising events, charity shops and our supporters.

St Peter's Hospice aims to provide people nearing the end of their life with the very best end of life care, delivered to the highest professional standards within an environment of support, comfort, compassion and respect.

Baileys Court is getting a New Play Area



The Baileys Court Activity Centre Play Area has been very used for over 26 years, proving to be one of the most popular play areas in the town. However, some parts of the play area have now become weary and need a makeover. The good news is that Bradley Stoke Town Council have decided to completely redevelop the Play Area.

The Town Council aims to provide the community with an exciting and inclusive new play space for families and children. This project has the support of the local school, parents, visitors and Activity Centre hirers.

The invitation to tender was advertised and the Town Council was overwhelmed with designs and quotations from nine companies, who all have proven credentials across the UK.

The Activity Centre's Manager, Mrs Del McIntosh, who is acting as the Town Council's Project Co-ordinator, thanked all the companies for submitting impressive designs for consideration.

After the close of tenders, the Councillors and Council Officers met to open the tenders. Councillors Tom Aditya, Dr Ed He, Brian Hopkinson, Angela Morey and Andy Ward, along with Town Clerk, Sharon Petela and Del McIntosh assessed all tenders and designs and then awarded points using the criteria matrix previously agreed at the Finance Committee.

Two companies were remarkably close in the awarding process and after much discussion it was agreed to recommend that the contract for this work be awarded to Kompan. This recommendation was subsequently formally agreed at the Annual Town Council Meeting on 26th May 2021.

The estimated total cost will be £105K, funded by the Town Council and two external funding sources. The Town Council was able to secure £30,000 from Enovert Community Trust and £14,195 from lbstock Enovert Trust, leaving the remaining balance of £66,805 to be covered by the Town Council Reserves, which has been possible following many years of careful financial planning.

The new play area works are anticipated to take place as soon as possible.

Bradley Stoke Town Council hosted a Mayor's Charity evening on Friday, 16th July 2021 at the Jubilee Centre Oak Hall. This was an informal gathering of the Mayor's Charites over the past two years. The meeting however was an opportunity for Councillors and Council Staff to appreciate the work of charities, to comprehend how Bradley Stoke's support was helpful and to explore ideas for future collaboration. The ceremonial cheques were presented to the respective charities and a photo session also ensued.

Past Mayor, Councillor Tom Aditya had chosen Great Western Air Ambulance Charity (GWAAC), the National Autistic Society (NAS) – South Gloucestershire branch and the Bristol Multi-Faith Forum (BMFF)'s Blood & Organ Donation Campaign as his charities during 2019/2020 whereas GWAAC and Next Link Charity were chosen by Past Mayor, Councillor Tony Griffiths as his Mayoral Charities during 2020/2021.

NAS South Gloucestershire Treasurer Mr Jack Whittaker, BMFF Blood and Organ Donation Campaign Secretary Mrs Tripti Megeri, Great Western Air Ambulance Community Coordinator Mr Joe Hughes, and Next Link Support Charity Deputy CEO Mrs Jayne Whittlestone received the cheques on behalf of their corresponding charities and expressed thanks to Bradley Stoke Mayoral Charity.

Ms. Anna Perry, the Chief Executive of Great Western Air Ambulance in her thanks note sent earlier acknowledged the help from Bradley Stoke Mayoral Charity and commented: " It was a real pleasure to work with Bradley Stoke Council. The amount raised is genuinely wonderful and would fund potentially lifesaving missions and tactical vests for our critical care doctors and specialist paramedics. This is an amazing contribution towards our shared community and something Bradley Stoke should all feel rightly proud about. Almost 4 million pounds is needed annually to keep the GWAAC service moving. Many of our services are run by volunteers. Nevertheless, the helicopter, ambulances, its upkeep, fuel, and costs for hangarage, doctors, paramedics, drugs, blood, equipment, technical staff and officers are essential part of the service. GWAAC is here to help the community in the hours of an emergency. Your help is much appreciated. Thank you"

The funds to Mayoral Charities are generally raised from donations at Bradley Stoke Community Festival, Big Fireworks, Carnival, Fun Fair and Scarecrow Trail. Clubs, organisations, event hosts, individuals and businesses also tend to contributes towards the Mayoral Charity. Many events were cancelled due to the pandemic since last year. Yet, an amount of £8237.23 was raised in 2020 and an amount of £4404 was collected in 2021. Cllr Michael Hill, Cllr Tony Griffiths, Cllr Tom Aditya, Cllr Angela Morey and Town Clerk Sharon Petela hosted the gathering on behalf of the Bradley Stoke Town Council

Everyone who attended felt that it was highly motivating and inspiring gathering.

The judging was not without incident and there were several blatant attempts to curry favour from the judges!





A big Thank you to everyone who entered or who gave up their day to be a judge or who have donated prizes, the competition would be nothing without you!

Grant Aid

Bradley Stoke Town Council has allocated a sum of money each year for grant aid to be awarded for small projects that benefit the local community (maximum grant is £500.00). All applications are considered on their merits. Application forms may be obtained from the BSTC Office. Grant Aid is only available to organisations and not individuals. There is also a Community Development Grant Funding budget available for bigger projects (maximum grant £4,000).
