It is with great grief and a heavy heart, Bradley Stoke Town Council share the sad news that Councillor Michael Hill, the Town Mayor and the Chair of Council passed away on 20th November 2021 following a short illness. He was 78.

Members and Staff of the Town Council paid tributes to his memory and conveyed their deepest condolences to Councillor Hill's family and friends.

Michael John Hill was born and educated in North London. He started his career in a weekly newspaper, then moving on to become a press officer of London Transport. Michael spent most of his career on media duties with the Ministry of Defence. At different times, he was head of public relations at the Royal Air Force Headquarters at High Wycombe and latterly at the Royal Navy's Fleet

Headquarters at Northwood. His travels took him from Hong Kong to the Falkland Islands and from the West Indies to the Persian Gulf.

Michael started his political innings at the London Borough of Barnet in 1974 and served as a Borough Councillor at Barnet for 12 years. Afterwards, he moved to Northampton and served on Northampton Borough Council for 18 years, where he was Mayor in 2009-10. He served four years as a Northamptonshire County Councillor from 2005 to 2009 as well.

Michael and his wife moved to Bradley Stoke in 2017 and in 2019, he was elected to the Bradley Stoke Town Council, representing the South Ward. In May 2021, Michael was elected as Mayor/Chair of Bradley Stoke Town Council.

Michael was a very caring, proactive person who had a wealth of councillor experience stretching back over many years. He will be sorely missed by everyone who came in contact with him.

St Peter's Hospice is the only adult hospice providing care for patients with life-limiting illnesses across Bristol, North Somerset, South Gloucestershire and parts of Bath and North East Somerset, an area covering almost 1 million people. Bradley Stoke Town Council fund electric bike for local police beat team

In August 2021, Avon & Somerset Constabulary, Bradley Stoke police beat team applied for grant funding to purchase two electric bicycles (and supporting equipment) to be used by two PCSOs in Bradley Stoke. The extract below is part of the police beat team's application:



"By us having our own bikes this would bring public confidence in their beat officers and much needed reassurance in our community, If we had our own bikes we would be more approachable as currently we drive a vehicle around Bradley Stoke which does not give members of public the chance to stop and speak to us if we're driving past, where if we were riding past it would be highly likely for the community members to stop and discuss issues or just have a chat."

Councillors agreed to the funding of one of the two electric bicycles (£2,227.92) as it will lead to a more visual police presence in the community and is a greener alternative to petrol/diesel vehicles with the following conditions: Avon & Somerset Constabulary fund the cost of the second electric bicycle, take on the maintenance cost of the vehicles and the bicycles must remain for use by the police in Bradley Stoke only and are not moved to other areas of the constabulary.

Bradley Stoke Councillors Surgery relaunched by Cllr John Ashe and Cllr Tom Aditya

Bradley Stoke Councillors Monthly Advice Surgery were relaunched at the Willow Brook Shopping Centre after a gap of eight years, on Saturday, 31st of July 2021 by Cllr John Ashe and Cllr Tom Aditya. On the re-launch day itself, many residents and visitors came up with their concerns and issues. Matters concerning footpaths, parking, access hazards, noisy neighbours, smelly litter bins, non-collection of green bins, vaccination, covid testing, quarantine, speeding were general topics of concern, however, there were also complaints which fell within the remit of the Bristol City Council and other nearby councils, which were courteously signposted. Councillors expressed appreciation to all residents who engaged with the surgery.

The purpose of the councillors surgery is to give local residents, an extra outreach opportunity to speak to councillors regarding council services and activities. At the monthly advice surgeries, attending councillors will collect information from the residents using the prescribed feedback forms and will pass it to the council office and make sure that each issue that comes before them are appropriately taken care of.



Councillors surgeries are undertaken completely voluntarily by the councillors. However, two councillors shall ideally staff each surgery. Cllr John Ashe, who is the South Gloucestershire Councillor for Bradley Stoke South Ward and the Bradley Stoke Town Councillor representing the Stoke Brook Ward has been involved in all councillors surgeries since they restarted as he felt that councillor surgeries as forward-looking and friendly occasions which helps to signpost matters without much difficulty.

Cllr Tom Aditya, who is BSTC Spokesperson, Finance Committee Chairman and Chairman of the South Glos Council's Community Engagement Forum for Bradley Stoke and Stoke Lodge commented: "I am glad to volunteer for the councillors surgery at the shopping centre since it helps me to easily connect with my constituents and also helps residents to effortlessly link with me as their representative. It is educative, engaging and enriching".

Councillors also thanked Willow Brook Centre and their staff for their support and co-operation for the smooth conduct of the councillors monthly advice surgeries.

The numbers of people attending the event was noticeably lower than previous years (likely due to the COVID-19 pandemic) and this was reflected in the charity bucket collection total as detailed below. However, it was lovely to see so many residents of the town gathering to enjoy the free event. Looking at local social media, this year's low noise event has seen both positive and negative feedback.

The event could not run without the outstanding support from the volunteer marshal and bucket collectors from a range of local groups including Little Stoke Social Club, one of the Mayor's Charity groups (Dogs for Good) as unfortunately, the other organisation (St Peter's Hospice) were unable to join us this year, Bradley Stoke in Bloom/Three Brooks Nature Conservation Group, the young people of Bradley Stoke, the local police Beat Team and BSTC councillors and staff. Once again, Bradley Stoke Radio supported the event and also provided marshals/bucket collectors. The Town Council would like to thank all those who assisted at this year's event.

Bradley Stoke Rotary Club ran the BBQ (which is one of their major fundraisers for their Charity each year). This year, they have indicated that they raised in the region of $\mathfrak{L}1,300$ for their charity.

The bucket collection has now been counted and the final total was €2,401.26

This amount does not include donations from the commercial food vans which are as follows:

- Doughnut and coffee van donation = £120.00
- Catering vehicles donation = £340.00

Adding this to the bucket collection total, it makes a grand total of £2,861.26 to be added to the Mayor's Charity.










Review of litter and dog waste bins in Bradley Stoke

In the early part of 2022, Bradley Stoke Town Council will be reviewing the locations of all the dog waste bins and general litter bins in the town. The dog waste bins that we currently have are the responsibility of the town council and we pay South Gloucestershire Council to empty them on our behalf. The general litter bins are split between the town council and South Gloucestershire Council and we share emptying responsibilities.

We will be asking residents to suggest possible locations for more bins around the town. Keep an eye out on the town council website and Facebook page for more information.

Town Council Office at the Jubilee Centre

For many years, the Town Council rented commercial space for their main office on the north fringe of Bradley Stoke. When the lease was coming to an end, councillors decided to look at various options to achieve greater value for money and to consider an office with improved accessibility as Councillors and office staff were aware that the office was in an out-of-the-way location and would benefit from being closer to the centre of Bradley Stoke. These options included renegotiating a new lease at the existing office at an increased cost, leasing a new office in the newly built Willow Brook Centre or building a new office at the Jubilee Centre.

After a lot of research and cost comparisons the options were presented to residents in a public consultation and the decision was then made to build a new standalone office at the Jubilee Centre as this best met both the longer-term cost benefits and location criteria set by council. Councillors were aware that the cost to residents (through the Precept) was very important, given the economic climate, so the Town Council decided the most cost-effective option was a Public Works Loan to finance the new build. It was always anticipated that the cost of any annual loan repayments would be below that paid to rent their existing office space. The loan would also provide a fixed annual cost at a low rate for a set period of 10 years as opposed to potential rental increases over future years. Once the loan was paid off, the Town Council would then own the building, thereby increasing the material assets of Bradley Stoke Town Council whilst also saving the community future rental expenditures and being near the centre of the community.

The Town Council went ahead with the Public Works Loan and officially moved into their new office at the Jubilee Centre on 18th June 2012. The office was formally opened by Jack Lopresti, MP and Mayor/Chair of Council Councillor Charlotte Walker on 14th September 2012.

Ten years later, the Town Council are pleased to announce that the Public Works loan has now been fully paid off. The councillors wish for a higher profile central location for the office has been achieved with many more visitors to the office than when it was located on the outskirts of the town.







All Council and Standing Committee meetings are open to the public and the press. At any of the meetings there is time for electors to ask questions during public question time. Times and dates of meetings are published on the Town Council Noticeboards and on the Town Council Web Site.

Bradley Stoke Town Council has allocated a sum of money each year for grant aid to be awarded for small projects that benefit the local community (maximum grant is £500.00). All applications are considered on their merits. Application forms may be obtained from the BSTC Office. Grant Aid is only available to organisations and not individuals. There is also a Community Development Grant Funding budget available for bigger projects (maximum grant £4,000).
