Mayor's Charities



Our Great Western Air Ambulance Charity (GWAAC) Critical Care Team stand ready to save the lives of local people.

We provide emergency care to people who are in a state so critical that they require the specialist skills of our team at the scene of the accident or medical incident. Though we are part of the regional 999 response service and work closely with NHS hospitals, we are a charity entirely funded by local people just like you.

GWAAC saves lives across Bristol, Bath and North East Somerset, South Gloucestershire, Gloucestershire, North Somerset and parts of Wiltshire.

Without you, we couldn't do it.

It's your support that allow us to keep the air ambulance going, so our team can keep saving lives.

We don't simply fly people to the nearest hospital. Our priority is to get to the patient fast. We treat people at the scene, on the road and in the air, providing complex interventions to stabilise and treat the patient and give them the best chance of a positive outcome. The service we provide is reliant on our brilliant team of pilots, Advanced and Specialist Paramedics and Consultant Doctors who specialise in pre-hospital care.

Everyone with a life limiting illness deserves access to the best possible care and to live their final days with dignity.

Every year St Peter's Hospice makes a difference in the lives of thousands of patients and their families when it matters most. Whether that is help managing pain, bereavement support

or providing relief from symptoms, the hospice team works 24/7 to support individuals and families as they navigate the challenges of living with a life limiting illness.

Our Inpatient Unit is a state-of-the-art centre of clinical excellence, that was built with the generous support of the people of Bristol. Beyond our Inpatient Unit, you'll find our team in homes and on the phone 24/7. More recently in response to the pandemic we have moved some services online to continue support for our patients.

When many people think of hospice care, they picture going somewhere to be looked after during the last days of their life. They're not wrong — we do offer inpatient care. But many St Peter's Hospice patients receive our care over several months in the comfort of their own homes, while others might join our virtual groups. We recognise that people's needs can change over time - that's why our range of services offer different types of support at different times.

No matter what form our support takes, people's individual needs are at the heart of that support.



The Hospice is also a centre of educational excellence, and we teach other healthcare professionals about how to care for people at the end of their lives, supporting the NHS and care homes provide end of life care. However, despite being a front-line service, only 22% of our funding comes from the NHS. The rest is raised in our community.

All this work would not be possible without the support of you, our wonderful community. Every time you shop with us, donate, take part in an event, sponsor a friend or volunteer with us, you make a difference in the lives of some of the most vulnerable in our community. We cannot thank you enough.

Bradley Stoke Town Council Fireworks Display 6th November 2022

The 2022 Firework Display was, once again, another successful event, raising £2,834.64 for charity and thankfully the weather held, the strong winds which had been forecast earlier in the day did not materialise.

The numbers of people attending the event have not yet returned to the pre-COVID pandemic levels, plenty of positive feedback was received from those attending, especially regarding the return, this year, of traditional fireworks, which were not low-noise. It was lovely to see so many residents of the town gathering to enjoy this event, which we continue to make free to all.

The fireworks could not run without the outstanding support from the volunteer marshal and bucket collectors from a range of local groups including Little Stoke Social Club, volunteers from the two Mayor's Charity groups (Great Western Air Ambulance Charity and St Peter's Hospice), Bradley Stoke in Bloom, Three Brooks Nature Conservation Group, the young people of Bradley Stoke, and BSTC councillors and staff. Once again, Bradley Stoke Radio supported the event keeping the crowds on the Jubilee Green entertained. Once again, the Town Council would like to thank all those who assisted at this year's event.

Bradley Stoke Community Warm Spaces

Bradley Stoke Town Council has set up some warm spaces across our three sites (Baileys Court Activity Centre, Brook Way Activity Centre and the Jubilee Centre) which offer a friendly welcome and are free to use. Hot drinks and biscuits will be provided. Grant funded through South Gloucestershire Council Welcome Spaces scheme.







Generally, the warm spaces are open at all three sites (see our website and noticeboards for details). Brook Way – Monday, Wednesday and Friday, Baileys Court – Tuesday and Jubilee Centre – Thursday.

Note during the February half term (Monday 13th – Friday 17th February 2023), Brook Way Activity Centre will be closed however Baileys Court Activity Centre and Jubilee Centre will be open all week.

New Public Access Defibrillator for the Town

Following on from research undertaken by Councillor Terri Cullen, the locations of public access defibrillators have been reviewed in Bradley Stoke and the surrounding area. The review identified that there are public defibrillators in the middle and south of the town but nothing in the north. The Town Council have therefore agreed to fund the purchase and installation of a new public access defibrillator for the outside of the Brook Way Activity Centre

The Town Council has teamed up with Great Western Air Ambulance Charity who work with Heartsafe to provide an all-in-one lifesaving automated external defibrillator.



Local Nature Action Plan

Bradley Stoke Town Council, in partnership with South Gloucestershire Council and local community groups, has recognised the importance of taking steps to address the ecological challenges our world is facing. A Local Nature Action Plan has been developed in order for us to take the necessary steps to improve the biodiversity in Bradley Stoke. Our plan was officially adopted at the Full Council meeting on 16th November 2022.

There are a number of ongoing projects which the Town Council have started linked to the Local Nature Action Plan in Bradley Stoke

Refurbishment of Davis Pond

The small pond on the Jubilee Green was in need of an overhaul and the Town Council are pleased to announce that the work long is due to be carried out in the next few months with a hope to increase biodiversity of the pond and surrounding area. It is hoped that this work will transform the area into a vibrant setting for the local community to enjoy.

Free Tree/Hedge Giveaway event

The Town Council allocated a budget to purchase trees/shrubs and hedges and then arranged a community event during which the trees, shrubs and hedges were given away to residents of the local community. A large number of small saplings were also donated to this event by Councillor Tom Aditya.

The event was held at the Jubilee Centre on Saturday 28th January 2023 and was an amazing success with positive feedback received. More than 80 local residents collected trees/shrubs/hedges and marked their planting locations on the map (see completed map below).



Hedgehog Heroes

The Town Council are hoping to be actively involved in the South Gloucestershire Council, Hedgehog Heroes initiative, so watch this space for further information over the next couple of months This event was supported by Bradley Stoke Zero Carbon Community Group, Bradley Stoke in Bloom and South Gloucestershire Council, who were all on hand to give expert advice.

WHAT DO LOCAL COUNCILS DO?

Your local (parish and town) council has overall responsibility for the wellbeing of your local community. Their work falls into three main categories:

- Delivery of services
- · Improve quality of life for residents
- · Give communities a democratic voice

Local councils run numerous services, depending on the size of the council. Many you will see day-to-day, but some are less known. These include introducing solar panels, setting up dementia-friendly groups, organising community buses, creating neighbourhood plans, implementing suitable housing, establishing youth projects, managing allotments and open spaces, maintaining footpaths, public seating and litter bins.

BECOMING A LOCAL COUNCILLOR

As a local councillor you can become a voice for your community and make real change. Local councillors are the champions of their community who invest time in local projects and issues to the benefit of residents and the neighbourhood.

Local councillor responsibilities fall into three main categories:

- Decision-making
- Monitoring
- Getting involved locally

Local councillors attend to local needs of residents, local groups and businesses, make decisions on local services, collaborate with district and borough councils to adhere to local needs, and progress vital projects to invest in the future of the community.


CAN I STAND FOR ELECTION?


To stand for election to a local council you must be:

- A UK or Commonwealth citizen; or be a citizen of the Republic of Ireland; or be a citizen of another Member State of the European Union
- · At least 18 years old
- An elector of the local council; or in the past 12 months occupied land or
 other premises in the area the local council serves (as owner or tenant);
 or work in the area local council serves (as your principal or only place of
 work); or live within three miles of the local council boundary

Meetings

As well as Full Council, there are three Standing Committees for Finance, Planning & Environment and Leisure, Youth & Amenities. All Council and Standing Committee meetings are open to the public and the press. At any of the meetings there is time for electors to ask questions during public question time. Times and dates of meetings are published on the Town Council Noticeboards and on the Town Council Web Site.

Bradley Stoke Town Council has allocated a sum of money each year for grant aid to be awarded for small projects that benefit the local community (maximum grant is £500.00). All applications are considered on their merits. Application forms may be obtained from the BSTC Office. Grant Aid is only available to organisations and not individuals. There is also a Community Development Grant Funding budget available for bigger projects (maximum grant £4,000).
